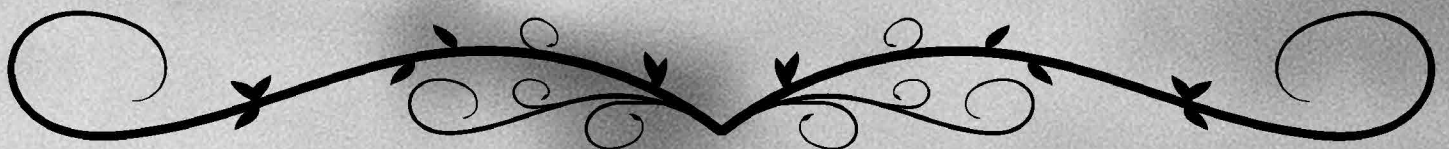
Costuming
