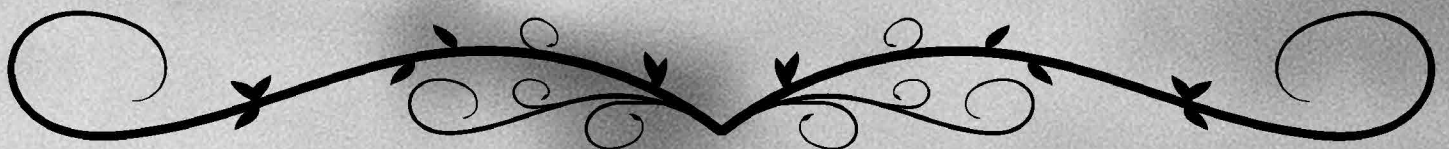
Costuming
