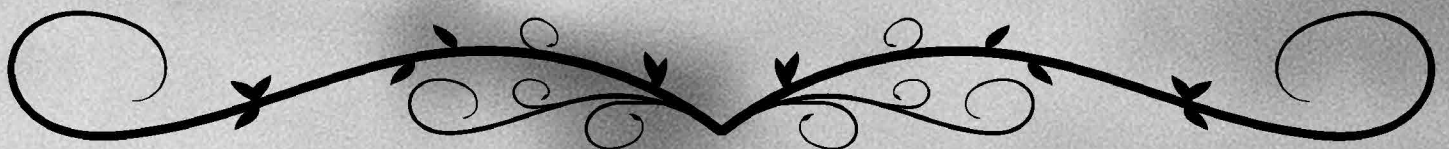
Costuming
